Here are some insider tips to save time at our offices:

- Visit www.pbctax.com to renew motor vehicle registrations, pay business taxes, or make a driver license appointment. The **deadline** to pay business taxes without a penalty is September 30.
- Text "waitpbcc" to 41411. We'll send you current wait times for all office locations. Times are approximate and show how long you can expect to wait after you reach the reception desk.
- Renew for two! Renew your motor vehicle registration for two years instead of one.

Moved Recently? — Contact the Property Appraiser's Office at (561) 355-2866 to update your mailing address. We use the information they have on file to mail your 2016 Property Tax bill in November. visit www.pbctax.com/fl-laws.

Items placed at the curb are consistently removed for safety purposes, but residents who don't adhere to the schedule and guidelines, may be cited and billed.

Reminders:

- All garbage carts must have the lids completely shut,
- Black garbage carts = Household waste,
- Green vegetation Cart = Leaves, small yard waste only. Other refuse can contaminate and prevent recycling,
- Green cart/yellow lid = Recycling material only. No garbage or vegetation permitted.

Proper materials include:

- Plastic
- Glass
- Aluminum
- Cardboard
- Paper

Prohibited items:

- Roofing materials
- Wood products
- Toxic chemicals
- Plumbing fixtures
- Oil
- Paint
- Drywall
- Fencing
- Concrete
- tubs
- Steel

Lake Worth Library 75th Anniversary



Please join the City of Lake Worth to celebrate 75 years of the library's history and unique charm. The community is invited to an Open House event and tour.

Did you know?... It all began in 1912, when a group of women who lived in Lake Worth organized a book drive to establish

a library in the community. And the Lake Worth Library Association was born. In its humble beginnings, the library was housed in several different buildings including City Hall. More than a decade later, Lake Worth residents voted to formally organize a library and adopted its name: Lake Worth Public Library. Citizens wanted a library building and rallied together to make it happen. Fundraising efforts, spearheaded by the Library Board, brought in donations from private donors which helped to build the new library, without government funding. The community raised money for 13 years – and in August of 1941, the library, with its own unique, architectural Mediterranean-style structure opened its doors where it remains today. The total cost to build and furnish the library at the time was \$66,000.
