Captain's Corner

Greetings, District 14 just received a new batch of Make the Call Ya'll cards. The cards now have both non-emergency numbers which are available to residents of the City of Lake Worth. 561.688.3400 is still PBSO's main non-emergency number. 561.586.1611 is a non-emergency number for City of Lake Worth residents only. This is the old non-emergency number from the former Lake Worth Police Department. When called it receives a higher priority than the regular non-emergency number. This should help you get through to a dispatcher when call volume is high.

I am often asked if deputies can be called on their cellular phone or e-mailed directly. This is not done for several reasons:

- Supervisors and Communications will not be aware of the call;
- The deputy might be out on extended leave;
- There is no record of the call for tracking purposes;
- Patrol deputies phones are typically personal phones not issued by PBSO.

- Roofing Materials,
- Any Wood Products,
- Cabinets,

- Doors,
- Drywall,
- Fencing,
- Concrete,
- Plumbing Fixtures,
- Tubs,
- Stumps,
- Steel,
- Oil,
- Paint,
- Toxic Chemicals.

Please note: Vegetation is not considered bulk. A fine could incur if prohibited items are left at the curb.

Reminder of Alteration of Water Chlorination Process

To maintain high water quality in the City of Lake Worth water distribution system, the City of Lake Worth Water Treatment Plant will temporarily change the water chlorination methods for two weeks from June 1 through June 19. The City of Lake Worth will also increase hydrant flushing during this time. This is a preventive maintenance process.
