



FAQs About Lake Worth Parking

Is paid parking enforced all day?

Paid parking is enforced 24/7 in metered parking areas and lots. Parking downtown is controlled by signs.

How do I obtain a Beach Parking Decal?

Beach Parking Decals are available only to residents who live in zip codes 33460 or 33461, in a limited area. Beach Decals may be purchased in-person at the City's Utilities Customer Service Department located at - 414 Lake Avenue, Lake Worth, FL 33461, in a limited area. How do I show that I am a resident?

Do I have to display my paid parking receipt in my car?

No, not required, however, you may display the parking receipt in the front window of your car showing that you have paid for the space, if you desire.

Is Handicap Parking free of charge?

Handicap Parking is free for the first four (4) hours, in designated Handicap Parking and meter spaces. There is no Handicap Parking in a designated Beach Decal space without a Beach Decal.



Why can't I back into a parking space?

City Ordinance 21-33h prohibits backing into parking spaces to prevent harm to persons and destruction of City property like plants, trees, meter poles, power poles and light poles.

Under what circumstances will my vehicle be towed?

Vehicles left in City parking lots or on City property continually or overnight may be towed.

How much does parking cost, and how do I pay?

Metered parking costs \$2 per hour and may be paid with coin, Visa or MasterCard credit cards. When paying with credit cards, a minimum two-hour fee will be charged. You may also use the Park-mobile app. Meter machines do not accept bills.

How do I pay a parking citation?

Citations may be paid in-person at Utilities Customer Service, or by mail at 414 Lake Avenue, Lake Worth, FL 33460 or online at www.remit-online.com/561001.

(In-person fees may be applied.)

How do I dispute a citation?

A Hearing Request Form may be picked up in-person at Utilities Customer Service located at 414 Lake Avenue, Lake Worth, FL 33460. How much time do I have to pay a citation, and what is the fine for an unpaid citation?

All citations must be paid within 15 calendar days. Any citations not paid within the 15-day period will incur added fines.
